Simple! Brian gained this modest approach playing for Jack Sharp in Aurora, and he attributes much of his success through the years to Jack. He also credits his wife Mary Kay with playing a significant role over the last 33 years and says he couldn't have done it without her.

Brian's simple philosophy comes from hours of coaching at the Fox Valley Park District, the Aurora Country Club, and the NITA girls 18 and under teams. He also spent 10 years on the basketball sidelines, honing his "under pressure" skills. Currently, Brian is the assistant tennis coach for the women's program at NIU and teaches at the Vaughan Athletic Center.
