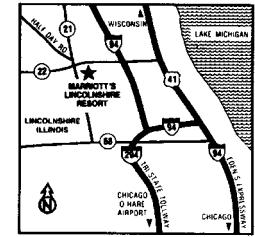

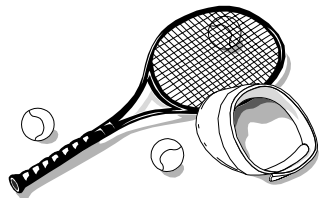

Mark Bey: USPTA, Mark Bey is a former college player and Founder and Director of CARE Academy. Mark has worked with many past and present college tennis players including the Bryan Brothers, Georgia Rose, Dennis Nevolo and Evan King. Mark is a regular presenter on The Tennis Channel's On Court.

Frank Barnes: Men's and Women's Tennis Head Coach at University of Wisconsin, Whitewater. Coach Barnes is also the Warhawk Tennis Camps director, which is one of the top summer tennis camps in the nation. He spent ten years as a tennis professional in Madison, Wisconsin. Frank has actively competed in state and regional sanctioned tournaments. He has been named WIAC coach of the year many times and was the recipient of the USTA/ITA Community Service Winner.

Wayne Bryan: Founded and ran the Cabrillo Racquet Club with numerous nationally ranked players and youngsters being awarded Division 1 tennis scholarships. Bryan was the number one player and captain of his U. C. Santa Barbara Tennis Team in the late 60s. Wayne is one of the top national tennis clinicians in the country who is known for his ability to entertain, motivate and educate. Wayne does interviews, team clinics, television commentary and other emcee work for the Tour and the Outback Champion series. Bryan's twin sons, Mike and Bob are currently the #1 ranked doubles teams in the world. Bryan's appearance is provided by Prince.

Jorge Capestany: USPTA Master Professional, Jorge is the manager of the DeWitt Tennis Center at Hope College. Jorge has been named Michigan Professional of the Year five times and Midwest Professional of the Year twice. He has developed hundreds of ranked juniors, including three national champions. Capestany is a favorite at both National and World Tennis Conferences. He has launched a video-based tennis instructional web site (www.tennisdrills.tv). Jorge's appearance is provided by Wilson.

Craig Jones: Craig has a long history of playing, teaching and promoting tennis. He grew up playing tennis and others sports in Union City, Tennessee and went on to play varsity tennis at Rhodes College in Memphis. Craig is committed to the game of tennis, which is evident by his long record of volunteerism. Craig has been honored as the Southern Pro of the Year, Junior Development Champion of the Year, Coach of South Carolina's Jr. Fed Cup and two time national champion 16s Intersectional Team Coach. Jones is a member of the Wilson Premier Advisory Staff and Wilson National Speaker's Bureau. His appearance is provided by the USTA.

Dr. Neeru Jayanthi: USPTA, Jayanthi is medical director of primary care sports medicine and an assistant professor in the departments of Family Medicine and Orthopaedic and Rehabilitation at Loyola University Chicago Stritch School of Medicine. Dr. Jayanthi has studied tennis injuries as a player, coach, physician and researcher. Neeru has been an avid player since childhood, and now plays at the highest ranked amateur level.

Michelle Krause: As National Cardio Tennis Program Manager and Speakers Team Director of Cardio Tennis, Michelle Krause is a founding member and lead organizer of the Cardio Tennis curriculum, a fun, action packed, program that combines cardiovascular fitness training with tennis technique. Created by the Tennis Industry Association and the USTA, cardio tennis launched onto the U.S. market in 2005. Michelle is the Director of Tennis at the Punta Gorda Club for Tennis & Fitness and is a graduate of Arizona State University. Her appearance is provided by the TIA.

Paul Lubbers: Paul is the Director of the USTA Coaching Education. In his role he directs the operations related to both Coaching Education and Sports Science. He is the former Head Men's and Women's Tennis Coach at the University of North Carolina Greensboro and a teaching professional in Atlanta, Georgia. Lubbers is very active as a speaker and writer contributing to conferences and publications associated with many of the world's top tennis organizations. He is a member of the USPTA and PTR. Paula Scheb: USPTA Master Professional, Paula played collegiate tennis for the Lady Gators at the University of Florida. Her team was ranked as high as number two in the country and she was named a doubles All American. She is the recipient of the national USTA/USPTA Community Service Award. Paula has been named the USPTA Florida Professional of the Year. She has taught clinics with Jack Groppe, Jim Loehr, Evonne Goolagong, Nick Bolloettieri, Andi Brandi, Stan Smith and countless others. Scheb is now the Director of Tennis and Fitness at the Bonita Bay Club in Southwest Florida. Her appearance is provided by Head/Penn.

Scott Ficks: USPTA is the Director of Tennis for Moorland Park Tennis Center. He was the Wisconsin USPTA State Pro the Year in 2008 and 2010.
